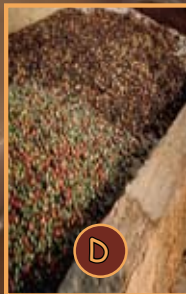
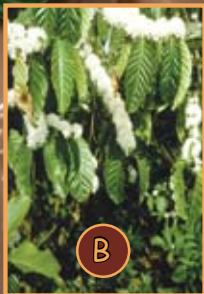

### Fun facts about coffee and chocolate

- The word chocolate comes from *cacahuatl*, a word that means "bitter water" in an Aztec language, Nahuatl.
- Cocoa powder is made from the pods of a cacao tree. These pods grow on branches and, curiously, the trunk too.
- It takes about 400 cacao beans to make one pound of chocolate.
- 65 countries in the world grow coffee—along the equator in the tropics.
- Ripe coffee beans are red and are called "coffee cherries."
- The caffeine in coffee beans repels many creatures that are tempted to eat them.
